  Proposed by Cllr Buxton, seconded by Cllr Skipworth and unanimously resolved to appoint Cllr Buxton
- (iii) It was then proposed by Cllr Lowe, seconded by Cllr Lucas and resolved with 5 votes for, and 3 abstentions that Cllr Brookes should be removed as Council's representative for the Neighbourhood Plan following a request from the Steering Group
- (iv) Proposed by Cllr Lowe, seconded by Cllr Wadsworth and resolved with 7 votes for and 1 abstention to appoint Cllr Lowe as the new representative for the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group
- (v) <u>St George's Barracks Development Committee</u>

3 nominations were received.

- Proposed by Cllr Buxton, seconded by Cllr Skipworth to elect Cllr Bottomley
- Proposed by Cllr Skipworth, seconded by Cllr Buxton to elect Cllr Skipworth
- Proposed by Cllr Brookes seconded by Cllr Bottomley to elect Cllr Brookes To determine the vote, it was agreed by a show of hands. The Councillor who had the lowest number of votes would be omitted and the vote taken again. The vote was Cllr Bottomley, 4 votes, Cllr Skipworth, 3 votes and Cllr Brookes, 1 vote. A new vote was taken. It was 4 votes for Cllr Bottomley and 3 votes for Cllr Skipworth. Therefore, Cllr Bottomley was appointed as Council's representative

#### 145/18 CHRISTMAS LIGHTS 2018 - 2020

Members considered the quotations and designs received. It was proposed by Cllr Buxton, seconded by Cllr Lucas and resolved with 7 votes for and 1 abstention that the provision of Oakham's Christmas display and tree be awarded to The Christmas Decorators for a three-year period 2018 – 2020, choosing option 2 with the coloured festoon lights and to approve the expenditure of £15,163 per year

It was proposed by Cllr Brookes, seconded by Cllr Wadsworth and unanimously resolved to agree to suspend Standing Order 28 in order that item 18 on the Agenda can be considered

# 147/18 CO-OPTION FOR THE OAKHAM NORTH EAST WARD VACANCY

Following receipt of two applications for the Oakham North East Ward vacancy, both applicants were considered for appointment:

Proposed by Cllr Lucas and seconded by Cllr Lowe to elect Mr Spencer.

Proposed by Cllr Wadsworth and seconded by Cllr Bottomley to elect Mrs Berry. There were no votes for Mr Spencer and 5 votes for Mrs Berry, therefore with an absolute majority, Mrs Berry was duly elected.

After the votes had been concluded at 8.03pm, the press and public were invited back into the meeting where the Chairman declared the successful candidate
