- 4. Maintain and improve OTC land and buildings for the benefit of the community.

- 6. Work with and in partnership with Rutland County Council and other partner groups.
- 7. Ensure robust financial controls are in place to enable the delivery of cost-effective services as required now and in the future.
- 8. Provide a supportive and professional environment for staff to enable professional development and ensure efficient and effective working practices.
- 9. Provide development for Councilors to enable them to fulfill their role skillfully and effectively.

(2) In 2019 OTC adopted a six-year Strategic Plan with the following four priorities:

Democracy:

The Town Council consists of an elected body of local people to provide a strong voice on decisions and services that affect the everyday life of local people including.

Community:

The Town Council seeks to always be at the heart of the community and its activities. It will work closely with the many local voluntary, business, community groups and third/public sector partners within Oakham that are key to vibrant and successful community life.

Environment:

Oakham has a strong identity and character due to its rich natural and built heritage. The Town Council will work to ensure this heritage is protected and enhanced for present and future generations, including especially those buildings and areas of land for which it is custodian.

Economy:

The Town Council will work actively with the business community and stakeholders to support the local economy and promote footfall also it will encourage good practice as an employer, landlord, steward of community assets and service provider.

To continue to maintain and update the website. Publish all information required by legislation and as much other information as possible on site.

To give residents and businesses the opportunity to express their views and represent these effectively.

To communicate effectively with residents, for example through our website and our Facebook page.

To explore new ways of communication.

To work effectively with the County Council and Councilors and other service providers.

To produce a Neighborhood Plan with Barleythorpe for Oakham and once adopted to use this effectively in planning related matters.

To further Community Actions in the adopted plan

To consider, from a local perspective, all planning and Enforcement matters that affect the town and provide comment on their impact on local residents, the wider community, and the rural nature of the town.

To encourage residents to become involved in projects, e.g., Neighborhood Plan, Parks, and Open Spaces

To work with residents to improve Community Resilience.

PROPOSALS

The first set, (1) strategic aims proposed these are discarded as redundant as they are covered by others. The agenda item paper is amended accordingly.
