Town and Country Planning Act 1990

The Town & Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012

**PROPOSAL:** (T1) 1 no. Yew tree - Crown lift up to 2.5 Metres, tip prune side branches by up to 1.5 metres to give adequate driveway clearance and tip prune side branches over decking area by up to 1.5 metres to allow light into the garden. (T2) 1 no. Yew tree - Tip prune branches fowling on wall to give 1 metre clearance and side branches over decking by up to 1.5 metres to allow light into the garden. (T3 - T8) 6 no. Yew trees - Shorten back lower canopy by tip pruning driveway side by up to 1.5 metres as part of a general tidy of the area.
