Candidates must also meet at least one of the following four qualifications.

- Prospective candidates are not permitted to attempt to canvass members of the Council with regard to their application. Members will report any such attempt to the Chairman who will then instruct the Clerk to write to the candidate stating that they will no longer be considered. However, please note that this does not prevent them from discussing the role of a Councillor with an existing member
