1. **The following guidance** has been compiled in accordance with [Government Guidelines](#). The guidance contained in this document applies to all Oakham Town Council flagpoles, and any future installations at Victoria Hall or elsewhere
2. **Oakham Town Council Flag**
Unless otherwise listed in the approved list of flags and on the date shown, the Oakham Town Council Flag will be flown.

3. **Flag Protocol for LGBT History Month**

Purpose

This protocol establishes Oakham Town Council's approach to flying the Inclusive Rainbow Pride Flag during LGBT History Month, observed nationally each February. It ensures visibility, inclusivity, and respect for statutory and civic traditions.

Principles

- Recognition: LGBT History Month is a nationally recognised observance highlighting the history, contributions, and rights of LGBT communities.
- Balance: The Council acknowledges the importance of visibility while ensuring flag-flying practices remain proportionate and respectful of wider civic protocols.
- Transparency: Decisions are made openly, in line with lawful governance and community expectations.

Protocol

- The rainbow flag will be flown on:
 - 1 February – to mark the launch of LGBT History Month.
 - 28 February (or 29 February in a leap year) – to mark the closing of LGBT History Month.
- The flag will not be flown continuously throughout the month.
- Additional displays may be considered for specific Council-hosted events during February, subject to prior resolution.

















Communication

- Public notices will explain the significance of the flag and the Council's chosen days of display.
- Messaging will emphasise Oakham's commitment to inclusivity, heritage, and lawful governance.

4. **Flags not included in the approved list**

No Organisation's flag may be flown other than those listed in the approved list of flags unless a formal request is received, approved and minuted by a meeting of the full council

6. Flying at half mast

- a. The Oakham Town Council Flag shall be flown at half-mast upon the announcement of the death of serving members of Oakham Town Council, serving members of Oakham Town Council staff, serving members of Rutland County Council, and past mayors of Oakham Town Council. The flag shall remain at half-mast for a maximum period of seven days and shall be lowered again on the day of the funeral.
- b. The Union Flag shall be flown at half-mast for all state-recognised deaths and shall remain at half-mast until the conclusion of the official period of mourning.
- c. In the event of the death of a serving Member of Parliament for the area, the Union Flag shall be flown at half-mast in Oakham, the county town of Rutland, until the end of the day of their funeral.
