To be eligible to become a Councillor, candidates must meet the following criteria.

I confirm that (please tick all which apply to you):

- I am 18 years of age or over
- I am a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen, a citizen of the Republic of Ireland, a qualifying EU citizen or an EU citizen with retained rights

Candidates must also meet at least one of the following four qualifications.

I confirm that (please tick all which apply to you):

- I have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of my nomination and the day of election or co-option.
- My main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of my nomination and the day of election or co-option has been in the parish area.
- I have lived in the parish area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of my nomination and the day of election or co-option.

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1972 Section 80 there are some reasons why a person is disqualified from being a Town Councillor

- I am not employed by the parish/town council or hold a paid office under the parish/town council (including joint boards or committees).
- I am not the subject of bankruptcy restrictions order or interim order.
- I have not been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more (including a suspended sentence), without the option of a fine, during the five years before the day of nomination and the ordinary period allowed for making an appeal or applications in respect of the conviction has passed.
- I have not been disqualified under the Representation of the People Act 1983 (which covers corrupt or illegal electoral practices).
- I am not subject to the notification requirement of or under Part 2 of the Sexual Offences Act 2003, and the ordinary period allowed for making an appeal or application in respect of the order or notification has passed.
- I have not have been convicted of an intimidatory criminal offence motivated by hostility towards a candidate, future candidate or campaigner or holder of a relevant elective office, relevant elective office for five years.
